

Cue Ball Network Cookie Policy

§ 1. General information

1. This Cookie Policy explains how the **Cue Ball Network** website and application (<https://cueball.network>) use cookies and similar technologies.
2. The controller of the website is **CUE BALL NETWORK SP. Z O.O.**, ul. Żurawia 6/12 lok. 745, 00-503 Warszawa, KRS 0001128460. Contact: contact@cueball.network.
3. The rules governing the processing of personal data, including data collected by means of cookies, are additionally set out in the **Privacy Policy**.

§ 2. What cookies are

1. Cookies are small text files stored on the User's terminal device while using the Service. They may be read on subsequent visits.
2. The Service may also use technologies of a similar nature (e.g. local storage), to which this Policy applies accordingly.
3. Cookies may originate from the Controller (**first-party cookies**) or from third parties (**third-party cookies**), e.g. an analytics provider.

§ 3. Legal basis

1. The storage of and access to information on the terminal device takes place on the basis of the User's consent, in accordance with the provisions on electronic communications, with the exception of cookies necessary to provide the service requested by the User.
2. To the extent that cookies involve the processing of personal data, the legal basis is consent (Art. 6(1)(a) GDPR) or the Controller's legitimate interest with respect to necessary cookies (Art. 6(1)(f) GDPR).

§ 4. Categories of cookies used

The Service uses two categories of cookies:

1. **Necessary** – required for the operation and security of the Service (login, session maintenance, protection against abuse, remembering the cookie choice) and for error monitoring ensuring the stability of the Service (**Sentry** – basic error monitoring). They do not require consent.

2. **Analytics and diagnostics** – require consent, are disabled by default and are activated only after it has been given. They include: a) statistics and analysis of Service usage based on **Google Analytics 4**, loaded via **Google Tag Manager**; b) **session recording (Sentry Session Replay)** for diagnostic purposes – recording takes place with content masking (data minimization), but it is not necessary to provide the Service and therefore requires consent.

The Controller **does not use** marketing or advertising cookies (remarketing, advertising pixels). For traffic statistics the Controller also uses **Vercel Web Analytics**, which operates **without cookies** and does not store information on the device (details in the Privacy Policy).

The names and storage periods of cookies may change on the provider's side; the current list is presented in the consent management tool on the Service. Google Tag Manager does not itself store cookies – it is used solely to manage the loading of tags (see § 6).

§ 5. Managing consent

1. On the first visit to the Service, a banner is displayed enabling the User to **give or refuse** consent to cookies other than necessary ones. Consent is voluntary and may be changed or withdrawn at any time.

2. Cookie settings may be changed at any time through the appropriate option on the Service and at the browser level.
3. The withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out before its withdrawal.
4. Restricting the use of cookies may affect certain functionalities of the Service.

§ 6. Third-party cookies and data transfers

1. Analytics and diagnostics cookies are handled by third parties: **Google** (Google Analytics, Google Tag Manager) and **Sentry** (session recording – Session Replay). The rules governing the processing of data by these providers are set out in their documents.
2. In connection with the use of Google and Sentry services, data may be transferred outside the European Economic Area; such transfers take place on the basis of the safeguards referred to in Chapter V of the GDPR (including standard contractual clauses or the EU–U.S. Data Privacy Framework). More information is available in the Privacy Policy.

§ 7. Changes to the Cookie Policy

The Controller may update this Policy. The current version, together with its effective date, is published on the Service.
